Art

- The child learned to identify and match colors and shapes through the images on the bingo cards.
- They developed fine motor skills by picking up and placing the bingo markers on the corresponding pictures.
- By engaging with various images, the child's visual perception and creativity were enhanced.

English

- The child practiced vocabulary as they identified and named the pictures on the bingo cards.
- They also improved listening and comprehension skills as they listened for the caller to announce the pictures.
- Through social interaction during the game, the child practiced turn-taking and communication skills.

Math

- The game helped reinforce counting skills as the child placed markers on the called-out pictures.
