English

- Practiced communication and language skills by engaging in role-play and creating dialogue between the dolls.
- Enhanced vocabulary through describing actions, emotions, and needs of the baby dolls.
- Explored storytelling and narrative development by creating scenarios and plots for the dolls' daily routines.

Math

- Practiced basic counting and number recognition by setting the table or dressing the dolls with a specific number of items, such as utensils or clothes.
