Dramatic Play

- The 3 year old student demonstrated role-playing and storytelling skills by mimicking the actions of feeding a baby and creating imaginative scenarios during the activity.
- Through the activity, the student developed empathy and nurturing skills as they pretended to care for the baby dolls, showing compassion and understanding of others' needs.
- The child practiced fine motor skills and coordination by using utensils and feeding accessories to simulate the feeding process, enhancing their dexterity and control.
- Engaging in feeding baby dolls also provided an opportunity for the student to enhance their language and communication skills, as they may have described their actions, asked questions, or engaged in dialogue during pretend play.

For continued development, encourage the child to expand their role-playing scenarios by introducing new elements such as different types of food, feeding routines, and incorporating elements of language, social skills, and problem-solving into their play. You can also consider incorporating other dramatic play activities that encourage creativity and imagination, such as setting up a pretend kitchen or grocery store for further exploration of feeding and caring for others.
