English

- The student learned about storytelling and creative writing through the process of creating a starter story from a picture.
- They practiced visual interpretation and descriptive language by analyzing the image and translating it into a narrative.
- The activity encouraged the student to use their imagination and develop their storytelling skills through character development and plot progression.

Physical Education
