

Core Skills Analysis

Social Studies

- Through dressing the plastic baby doll, the 3-year-old student learns about role-playing and family dynamics, understanding caretaking and nurturing roles.
- The activity can help teach the importance of individuality and personal care as the child chooses outfits and colors for the doll.
- By mimicking daily routines like dressing a baby, the student grasps concepts of caregiving and responsibility within a family unit.
- The act of dressing the doll can also introduce basic social etiquette as the child learns how to gently handle and dress the 'baby'.

Tips

Encourage further development by expanding the activity into a storytelling session where the child creates narratives around dressing the doll, promoting imaginative play and communication skills. Additionally, introduce different cultural outfits or historical clothing to broaden the child's knowledge of diversity and traditions.
