Navigation

- The student learned about different types of maps, such as road maps, topographical maps, and thematic maps, through the visual representation in the song.
- By following maps and landmarks mentioned in the lyrics, the child gained an understanding of spatial awareness and directions.
- The activity introduced the concept of cardinal directions (north, south, east, west) and how they are used for navigation.
- Through the exploration of different locations in the song, the student could grasp the idea of distance and scale on a map.
