Play

- The 4-year-old student learned about light and shadows through the use of flashlights, understanding the concept of how light can create different shapes and sizes.
- Playing with flashlights encouraged the child's imagination as they explored various ways to create patterns and stories using light and shadows.
- Through this activity, the student developed their fine motor skills by manipulating the flashlight to direct light in different directions and angles.
- The child also learned about cause and effect by understanding how moving the flashlight closer or farther from a surface can change the size and intensity of the shadow.

Tips
