- The 3-year-old learned to observe patterns and sequences in the game, improving their attention to detail.
- Through the challenges in the games, the student practiced problem-solving skills by observing the environment and finding solutions.

- The child enhanced their memory skills by observing and recalling game rules and strategies during play.

Tips

To further encourage observational skills in young children, provide opportunities for them to notice details in their surroundings during everyday activities such as walks in the park or scavenger hunts at home. Encourage them to describe what they observe and ask open-ended questions to spark curiosity and observation. Offer a variety of games that require observation, such as memory games, I-spy, and puzzles, to continue strengthening this skill.
