

Core Skills Analysis

Art

- The 1-year-old student likely improved hand-eye coordination by placing the food items on the caterpillar image.
- Color recognition was reinforced through identifying and matching the various food colors.
- Creativity was encouraged as the student may have used different techniques to 'feed' the caterpillar.

English

- Vocabulary development occurred through association of food items with words like 'apple', 'pear', etc.

History

Math

Physical Education

- Fine motor skills were exercised as the student manipulated the small food pieces.

- Balance and coordination could have been enhanced during the activity.

Science

- Learning about lifecycle stages was initiated through the caterpillar-to-butterfly transformation.

Social Studies

Encourage language development by describing the food attributes or discussing where they come from. Additionally, introduce real-life experiences related to the story, such as visiting a garden to see real caterpillars and butterflies.
