

Core Skills Analysis

Art

- The activity helps infants develop fine motor skills by encouraging them to hold and manipulate the bubble wrap.
- Infants explore different textures and sensory experiences through the tactile sensation of the paint on the bubble wrap.
- Creative expression is fostered as infants engage in unique patterns and designs through the process of bubble wrap painting.
- The activity stimulates cognitive development as infants observe cause-and-effect relationships between their movements and the marks created on the paper.

Tips

Encourage infants to experiment with varying amounts of pressure to create different effects with the bubble wrap painting. Introduce different colors of paint to enhance color recognition and provide opportunities for sensory exploration. Allow infants to freely explore the medium without focusing on specific outcomes to promote a sense of autonomy and creativity.
