Art

- The 3-year-old student learned about color mixing by observing how primary colors blend and create new shades in the process of blow painting with straws.
- Through this activity, the student practiced hand-eye coordination and fine motor skills by controlling the direction and intensity of the paint as they blew through the straw onto the paper.
- The student explored creativity and imagination by experimenting with different blowing techniques to create unique patterns and shapes on the paper.
- By engaging in blow painting, the student developed sensory awareness as they felt the air pressure changes and observed the paint spreading on the paper in response to their actions.

Tips

Engage the child in discussions about the colors they are using and the patterns they are creating to enhance their understanding of artistic concepts. Encourage them to try different blowing techniques such as short bursts or long blows to discover new ways to manipulate the paint. Provide a variety of materials like different types of paper or textured surfaces to further expand their creative exploration. Remember to praise and celebrate the child's artwork to boost their confidence and enthusiasm for art.
