- The 6-year-old student learned new vocabulary related to animals such as 'giraffe', 'lion', and 'zebra' while discussing the different animals at the zoo.

Tips

Encourage creative writing by designing animal fact sheets or creating a mini-zoo booklet together. You could also organize a pretend play session where the child takes on the role of different zoo animals, promoting imaginative thinking and storytelling.
