

Core Skills Analysis

Art and Creativity

- Students explored color theory by observing how different food colors mix together.
- The activity encouraged free expression and creativity as students created unique patterns and designs.
- Participants developed fine motor skills through the action of dipping and throwing cotton balls.
- They learned about the effects of gravity and movement as they threw the cotton balls and observed how they landed on paper.

Science

- Students observed the physical properties of liquids and how they adhere to various surfaces.
- The activity introduced concepts of color mixing and the basic principles of chromatography as colors bleed and blend on paper.
- Participants engaged in hypothesis testing by predicting the outcomes of different throwing techniques or color combinations.
- They developed an understanding of the interaction between solids (cotton) and liquids (food coloring) through practical experimentation.

Physical Education

- Students practiced coordination and hand-eye coordination when throwing the cotton balls.
- The act of throwing involved gross motor skills that promote physical development and muscle control.
- They learned about the concept of force and distance by experimenting with how hard or soft they could throw.
- Students gained an awareness of their personal space and the space of their peers during the throwing activity.

Tips

This activity can be further improved by introducing various surfaces such as fabric or canvas to explore different textures, and more colors can be incorporated to enhance color mixing experiments. Students may also benefit from reflecting on the art they create by discussing their feelings about the piece and the techniques used.
