Art and Color Theory

- The student has learned to distinguish between warm colors (reds, oranges, yellows) and cool colors (blues, greens, purples).

Fine Motor Skills

Discussing emotions associated with colors can also enrich their learning, alongside guided activities that incorporate color-based storytelling or art projects.
