- The child learned about the plot, characters, and themes of Hamlet through the graphic novel format.
- They gained an understanding of Shakespearean language and style through the dialogue and narration in the graphic novel.
- The child developed their reading comprehension skills by following the story and understanding the events and motivations of the characters.
- They learned about the importance of visual elements in storytelling, as the graphic novel format combines text and illustrations to convey the story.
- The child practiced their critical thinking skills by analyzing the adaptation of Hamlet into a graphic novel and comparing it to the original play.
- They learned about the power of adaptation and how different mediums can present the same story in unique ways.
- The child gained exposure to classic literature and expanded their literary knowledge by reading Hamlet.

Continued development related to this activity could include:

- Encouraging the child to read more graphic novels or comic books that adapt classic literature or explore different genres.
- Having the child create their own graphic novel adaptation of a different Shakespearean play or another classic work of literature.
- Discussing the differences between the graphic novel adaptation and the original play, encouraging the child to think critically about the choices made in the adaptation.
- Exploring other forms of media adaptations, such as film or stage productions, and comparing them to the graphic novel adaptation.
- Encouraging the child to write a review or analysis of the graphic novel adaptation, discussing its strengths and weaknesses.
