- This exercise encouraged independent thought and initiative by allowing the student to make choices.
- Understanding the supermarket layout and how to navigate a catalogue builds practical skills that are beneficial for future shopping experiences.

To further enhance the child's learning experience, parents and teachers could set up minichallenges where the student has to compare prices from different shops or create a meal plan based on their shopping list. This encourages not just budgeting, but also nutritional awareness. Additionally, integrating interactive games that involve budgeting and shopping scenarios can provide a fun way to reinforce these skills.
