# **Core Skills Analysis**

#### **Mathematics**

- The child practiced counting by counting pieces of clothing as they loaded them into the washing machine.

### **Tips**

To further enhance the child's learning experience, consider introducing counting games related to laundry, such as counting items as they load them into the washing machine. Encourage discussions about colors and patterns in clothing to expand their vocabulary. Setting up a simple sorting activity, where the child organizes garments by type or color before washing, can reinforce categorization

skills. Additionally, you may wish to explore scientific concepts by discussing why clothes need washing and the role of different detergents and water temperatures in that process.
