

## Core Skills Analysis

### Science

- The student learned about equine biology by observing the horse's anatomy, such as understanding where muscles and bones are located beneath the skin.
- Grooming activities helped reinforce concepts of animal care, including the importance of hygiene and how it impacts a horse's health and well-being.
- The student observed the relationship between grooming tools and their purpose, as well as how different types of brushes cater to various tasks (e.g., removing dirt vs. smoothing the coat).

### Physical Education

### Art and Design

- Through observing the horse's coat variations and colors, the student developed an appreciation for aesthetic qualities in animals, linking to art concepts.
- The student can express creativity by deciding on grooming patterns or techniques, bridging artistic choices with practical application.
- Grooming a horse entails attention to detail, providing an opportunity to cultivate precision in their artistic endeavors, such as drawing or painting.
- The child was involved in selecting grooming tools based on colors and designs, merging design and function in a unique way.

This experience can deepen their understanding of horse care and the roles of different professionals in this field. You might also consider introducing them to animal anatomy books or documentaries that detail how various breeds are cared for differently.
