Core Skills Analysis

Language Arts

- The student improved vocabulary skills by encountering various words related to actions, strategies, and the game's storyline.
- They enhanced narrative skills by discussing the game's events, creating stories about their characters, and articulating encounters with zombies.
- Listening and comprehension skills were practiced during cooperative play, as the student needed to follow directions from teammates and communicate effectively.
- Expression of feelings and strategies was developed by negotiating roles and tactics within the game setting.

Mathematics

- The student practiced basic counting skills by keeping track of collected items and health points during gameplay.

- The student explored concepts of survival and adaptation by observing character strategies in a zombie apocalypse context.
- Encountering various zombie types allowed a practical discussion on differences in characteristics and behaviors, fostering curiosity about living organisms.
- The mechanics of health and injury led to lessons on body functions and the importance of health in both humans and fictional characters.
- Decision-making was a core component of the game, providing scenarios that involve causeand-effect thinking in terms of survival tactics.

Tips

To enhance the student's experience related to the game, parents and teachers can encourage storytelling sessions where the child narrates their gaming adventures, fostering creativity and language skills. Engaging in discussions about the teamwork strategies used in the game can deepen their understanding of cooperation. Parents might consider setting up playdates with peers to enable collaborative gameplay, further nurturing social skills. For additional activities, brief art projects themed around zombie characters or creating simple role-play games that focus on survival strategies can also reinforce concepts learned through the game.
