Art

- The child developed their creativity and imagination through designing and building a birdhouse.
- They learned about color selection and how to make their birdhouse visually appealing.
- They practiced fine motor skills while painting and decorating the birdhouse.

English Language Arts

- The child practiced their descriptive writing skills by writing a short paragraph about their birdhouse design.
