Facilitate discussions about the moral choices made in the game to deepen critical thinking regarding ethics and societal issues. Additionally, consider having them research the historical or cultural inspirations behind the game's setting and characters, which could enrich their understanding in Social Studies. Having them explore related activities such as creative writing, roleplaying sessions, or even drawing their favorite characters could further solidify their understanding of the narratives involved.
