Physical Education

Additionally, discussions about different horse breeds, care, and stories can deepen their interest in both animals and narrative skills. Further exploration can include organizing mini-competitions or obstacle courses, providing a way to apply mathematical concepts in real-time through counting, measuring distances, and timing events. Incorporating stories or films about horse riding might also expand their cultural understanding while inspiring imaginative play.
