Including dictation exercises where the student writes down dictated sentences containing target vowel combinations may deepen auditory-to-writing connections. To diversify exposure, reading aloud sessions with texts rich in homophones can improve pronunciation and contextual understanding. Additionally, incorporating digital tools like speech-to-text apps can allow the student to compare their typed output with spoken input, reinforcing self-correction and awareness.
