### Creative Thinking and Problem Solving

- Sarah engaged in creativity by customizing characters' appearance, homes, and surroundings, encouraging personal expression and design thinking.
- She experimented with hypothetical scenarios, testing solutions to challenges like maintaining relationships or achieving career goals, developing strategic thinking and adaptability.
- The game's open-ended nature allowed her to innovate and plan long-term objectives within the virtual world, which cultivates goal setting and perseverance.
- Sarah also practiced multitasking by simultaneously managing multiple characters' needs and schedules, improving cognitive flexibility.

### Tips

To deepen Sarah's learning from SIMS 4, encourage her to reflect on how the choices she makes in the game relate to real-life situations, possibly maintaining a journal comparing strategies and outcomes. Introduce storytelling by having Sarah write or narrate a character's life story, helping her practice narrative skills and empathy. To connect creativity with tangible skills, consider small design projects like drawing house floor plans or creating mood boards for character styles. Additionally, role-play situations from the game in real life to explore social skills and problem-solving face-to-face, enhancing interpersonal understanding and emotional intelligence.
