Tips

Extend math skills by comparing the Mexican peso to U.S. dollars using current exchange rates, involving real-world money math. Incorporate a creative storytelling activity where children invent short stories or 'biographies' about one of the people on the currency, enhancing both literacy and history comprehension. Additionally, exploring traditional Mexican art and symbols found on banknotes can provide interdisciplinary connections to art and social studies.
