## Geography

## **Tips**

Building on the activity of mapping Australia's neighbours, encourage Taonga to explore cultural and environmental aspects of these countries. For example, researching and presenting one key fact about each neighbouring nation can deepen understanding beyond location. Using interactive digital maps or tools like Google Earth could help visualize terrain and borders in three dimensions. Additionally, comparing map types (political, physical) and discussing why different maps emphasize various features will enrich mapping literacy and critical thinking.
