Tips

To further support writing improvement, incorporate multisensory activities such as using sand trays or finger paints to practice letter shapes. Encourage daily short journaling prompts to build confidence with expressive writing and fluency. Pair handwriting practice with reading aloud exercises to strengthen letter-sound relationships. Additionally, use technology tools like typing programs or tracing apps to mix fun with skill building, helping maintain motivation.
