Tips

To deepen understanding gained from playing 'Among Us,' encourage students to engage in reflective discussions about the social and cognitive strategies used during gameplay. Create roleplaying exercises where students simulate scenarios requiring accusation and defense to practice persuasive speaking and ethical considerations. Explore the psychological aspects of deception and trust through targeted readings, and incorporate writing prompts where students recount their experiences and analyze decision-making processes. Using real-life problem-solving tasks involving collaboration will help solidify these critical social-emotional skills in various contexts.
