Art and Visual Literacy

- Romi learned to distinguish between cartoon and realistic art styles by visually representing them side-by-side.
- He practiced symmetry and balance by dividing the drawing with a central line and maintaining proportionality on both sides.
- The activity encouraged observational skills as Romi translated realistic features into their cartoon equivalents.
- Romi developed fine motor skills and control while executing two different drawing techniques in a single image.

Tips

Encourage Romi to explore both art styles further by creating a collection of characters that mix cartoon and realism in new ways. Introduce simple anatomy and proportion lessons to deepen his understanding of realism. To extend creativity, challenge him to write a short story about the character, imagining how their cartoon and realistic halves might behave differently. Additionally, experimenting with different media such as colored pencils or digital tools could enhance his appreciation of texture and color in both styles.
