Social and Emotional Development

Tips

Use Barbie characters to explore different cultures, jobs, or historical periods to broaden understanding of the wider world. Incorporate simple DIY crafts by creating new clothes or accessories for the Barbies, integrating fine motor skills and artistic expression.
