

## Core Skills Analysis

### Science - Zoology and Animal Behaviour

- Participation in a structured group experience with adults and peers may have enhanced Logan's confidence and social communication skills.

### Tips

To extend Logan's learning from the zoo experience, encourage exploration of meerkat and other animal life cycles through books and videos to deepen understanding of their growth and survival. Create a simple habitat diorama or drawing project to visualize the meerkats' natural environment and discuss the importance of conservation. You can also design an interactive safety role-play that simulates being a zookeeper to strengthen awareness about animal care and safety protocols. Finally, engage in comparative learning by researching Australian native animals like koalas and bats, contrasting their habitats and diets with meerkats, to broaden ecological knowledge.
