### **Tips**

To deepen AJ's engagement and learning, encourage more complex dinosaur-themed activities such as creating simple stories or scenarios that involve counting dinosaurs, comparing sizes, and sequencing events. You could build a 'dinosaur habitat' sensory bin with natural materials to explore habitat science hands-on. Incorporating movement games where AJ imitates dinosaur movements can support physical development and coordination. Additionally, cooperative play with friends labeling dinosaurs or assigning roles will foster social skills and language development.
