Tips

To deepen the learning experience from cleaning the classroom, expand the discussion around environmental responsibility by exploring topics like recycling and reducing waste. Incorporate a 'before and after' photo activity to visually capture the impact of their efforts, reinforcing the value of their work. Invite children to create a classroom cleanup checklist or chart, which promotes planning and self-monitoring skills. Encourage reflection conversations afterward to discuss feelings about contributing to the community space, fostering social-emotional growth and a sense of belonging.
