Tips

Role-playing scenarios involving decision-making during travel can deepen their problem-solving skills. To enhance cultural understanding, parent-guided research or conversations about the destination's history, customs, and geography can provide context for the travel experience. Additionally, teaching basic safety and communication skills, such as how to ask for help or navigate public transportation, further prepares the student for independent adventures.
