Visual Perception and Attention

Tips

Tips: To further develop your child's visual perception and critical thinking skills, try incorporating a variety of search-and-find activities with different complexity levels and themes. Encourage your child to verbalize their search strategy or draw a map showing the areas they've already examined. Introduce timed challenges to balance speed with accuracy but emphasize that thoroughness is key. Additionally, combine the game with storytelling by creating new adventures for Waldo, which can foster imagination alongside visual skills.
