Tips

To deepen the student's appreciation and mastery of poetry styles, encourage them to copy and analyze poems in different styles from various authors. Then ask them to write their own poems inspired by those styles but about personal experiences or creative topics they choose. Consider integrating visual arts by illustrating their poems or creating a poetry anthology booklet. To promote oral communication skills, organize a poetry reading where the student can perform their works and receive feedback. Finally, exploring the history and cultural origins of different poetry styles can enrich the context and emotional connection behind their writing.
