Tips

Tips: To further deepen the student's understanding of myths and history, encourage storytelling sessions where they can narrate their own version of Atlantis or other mythical places. Planning an arts and crafts project to create underwater city models helps solidify spatial and historical awareness. Visiting a local aquarium or museum focusing on marine ecosystems or ancient civilizations can provide tangible experiences connecting myth to reality. Additionally, incorporate simple research activities to explore other myths from different cultures, supporting cross-cultural literacy and critical thinking.
