### Reading and Listening Comprehension

After listening to a book on tape, encourage your child to draw scenes or write a short summary to connect audio comprehension to visual and written expression. You might also explore acting out scenes together, turning stories into small plays, which reinforces narrative understanding and boosts confidence. Additionally, selecting audiobooks across different genres and cultural backgrounds broadens language exposure and cultivates curiosity about diverse perspectives. Setting regular listening times can make this activity a comforting and enriching routine.
