# **Art and Creativity**

### **Science and Sensory Exploration**

- Learned about shapes and symmetry by noting the shapes of potato halves and the prints they produce.
- Experimented with pressure and texture by varying how hard they pressed the potato stamp to create different prints.

### **Tips**

To further develop your child's understanding of this activity, try incorporating color theory lessons where they mix primary colors to create secondary ones using their potato stamps. Include discussions about different shapes by cutting potatoes into various geometric forms for printing. Extend sensory exploration by integrating other natural materials like leaves or sponges alongside potatoes for stamping, which helps broaden tactile experiences. Encourage storytelling by asking the child to create scenes or pictures with their prints and narrate the story behind their artwork, promoting language development.
