Reading stories or folktales from Russian culture can enrich vocabulary and cultural knowledge while making history and music more relatable. Listening sessions of Russian folk songs paired with movement activities can embed musical concepts and encourage physical expression. Encourage discussions about what differences and similarities the child notices compared to their own culture, fostering empathy and global awareness.
