Tips

To deepen understanding of visual art styles, encourage the student to research famous artists and movements linked to the styles studied. Organizing a mini art gallery at home or in class where the student can display their works mimicking different styles can provide creative motivation. Incorporating digital tools like art apps allows experimentation with styles and effects that may be difficult with traditional media. Finally, invite the student to reflect on and write brief artist statements explaining the choice of style and techniques, enhancing both critical thinking and communication skills.
