

## Core Skills Analysis

### Literacy

- Recognized and identified letters through the Humpty Dumpty egg letter matching, enhancing letter recognition skills.
- Developed phonemic awareness by associating rhyming words, which supports early reading readiness.
- Practiced fine motor skills and hand-eye coordination through manipulating egg pieces during matching.
- Engaged in auditory discrimination by differentiating rhyming sounds in the matched word pairs.

### Tips

To deepen understanding of letters and rhymes, parents and educators can incorporate movement-based rhyming games where the child hops or claps for each rhyming pair found. Introducing storytelling by creating new simple rhymes using the matched words encourages creativity and language use. Using tactile materials such as letter-shaped playdough or sand tracing for letters helps reinforce letter identification through multisensory learning. Finally, singing nursery rhymes with the child fosters a natural, enjoyable way to hear rhyme and rhythm.
