Tips

To deepen understanding of drama script formatting and its effects, encourage the student to write their own short scripts applying varied spacing styles and note how this changes the reading experience. They could perform scenes or read scripts aloud with a partner to feel pacing differences. Additionally, exploring published scripts from plays or movies to compare formatting can strengthen analytical skills. Integrating basic graphic design concepts, such as margins and font choices, will also enhance their awareness of how visual presentation supports drama and English literacy.
