Physical Education and Sportsmanship

Tips

To further develop understanding of refereeing in soccer, encourage your child to play mini-games where they take turns being the referee, which will help reinforce the importance of fairness and rule adherence. Use simple ruleboards or flashcards illustrating common fouls and decisions to support memory and rule recognition. Discuss emotions involved in refereeing, such as managing disagreement or frustration, to build emotional intelligence. You can also watch professional soccer matches together and focus on how referees make decisions and communicate on the field, highlighting real-life examples.
