Literacy

Tips

Encourage Cillian to talk about the stories he reads by asking open-ended questions about the characters, settings, and events. Try creating a 'book adventure' map at home where he can track his library visits and the books he's read, perhaps adding pictures or drawings inspired by the stories. Visit the library regularly to build comfort and routine, and consider attending library storytime or children's reading programs to enhance social and auditory skills. Additionally, involve Cillian in finding books related to his personal interests or current topics he is curious about, helping to make reading more meaningful and engaging.
