Tips

To deepen understanding and engagement, encourage the student to research David Attenborough's documentaries or books prior to writing another letter, enabling the inclusion of more informed questions or reflections. Organize a project where the student creates a mini-documentary or presentation about an animal or ecological topic inspired by Attenborough's work to blend creative and research skills. Incorporate discussions about how letter writing can be a tool for advocacy and inspiring change, linking to environmental activism. Finally, invite the student to write a response letter imagining a reply from Attenborough, cultivating empathy, creative writing, and perspective-taking.
