Emotional and Language Development

- Avva-Marie demonstrated an understanding of affection by hugging and kissing the plush globe, indicating emotional connection to symbolic objects.
- By signing the word 'love' in ASL, she engaged with non-verbal communication, showing early development in alternative language systems.
- The activity encourages empathy and global awareness, linking positive feelings to a representation of the world.
- She practiced fine motor skills and coordination related to signing, integrating physical movement with meaning.

Tips

To deepen Avva-Marie's understanding of emotions and communication, parents and educators can encourage repeated practice of simple ASL signs related to feelings, such as 'happy,' 'thank you,' and 'friend.' Creating storytime sessions featuring global themes and emotional expressions can broaden her awareness of the world and diverse cultures. Using a globe or world map during play to identify places while reinforcing affectionate gestures promotes geographic curiosity alongside emotional intelligence. Introducing role-playing activities where she expresses feelings through gestures or signing fosters confidence and strengthens language acquisition in both verbal and non-verbal forms.
