Tips

Tips: To deepen Enzo's understanding, consider engaging him in creating a map project where he traces the Trans-Siberian Highway and marks key cities or landmarks along the route. You could also explore stories or pictures from people who have traveled this highway to give a sense of the environment and culture there. Another fun idea is to compare the length of the Trans-Siberian Highway to local roads he knows, helping him relate scale and distance to his own world. Lastly, discuss the importance of building roads in challenging environments and how they affect the lives of people who live there, which can open conversations about geography, climate, and human adaptation.
