History

Chemistry

- Practiced calculating percentage yield, gaining quantitative skills in measuring efficiency of chemical reactions.
- Learned about atom economy, emphasizing the importance of resource efficiency and sustainability in chemistry.
- Used mole calculations as a basis to understand chemical quantities and relate them to real-world processes.
- Developed numeracy and problem-solving skills through practical chemistry formula applications.

Tips

To deepen understanding, encourage Aiyana to create a timeline project linking Cold War events to world consequences, integrating political, social, and cultural perspectives. For biology, a hands-on investigation to monitor eutrophication effects in local water bodies or a virtual lab on invasive species could bring concepts to life. In English, writing contrasting letters from the viewpoints of Lady Capulet and the Nurse to Juliet can develop empathy and analytical writing skills. Chemistry understanding can be extended by designing experiments to measure percentage yield in simple reactions and discussing green chemistry principles to connect atom economy with environmental responsibility.
