

Core Skills Analysis

Religious Education

- Matthew explored key scripture passages, gaining a deeper understanding of biblical stories and the concept of God's power.

- Water balloon and shaving cream fights encouraged playful social interaction and helped Matthew manage excitement safely.
- Learning to listen attentively and maintain quiet when appropriate refined Matthew's self-regulation and social awareness.
- Taking turns in lines and during activities reinforced patience and respect for others.

Tips

To deepen Matthew's engagement with scripture and mission stories, consider creating a story journal where he can illustrate and write about each story's key lessons. Integrating crafts tied to these stories, such as making service-themed cards for family members, will reinforce learning through creativity. For math-related skills, try baking together with different measuring tools or setting up a small pretend canteen at home to practice more complex transactions and making change. Physically, introducing new cooperative games that require teamwork and communication will boost social skills and physical fitness. Finally, incorporating mindfulness moments such as brief gratitude reflections before meals can strengthen the habit of prayer and appreciation learned at camp.
